

- Double Taxation Agreement with 11 countries 9 of which are European countries (Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Switzerland, United Kingdom)
- Bi-lateral & Investment Treaty with 7 countries (executed & ratified)

## Africa in Brief

Africa has a 1.3 billion-person market.

Economic growth: 3.4% in 2019 and was expected to pick up to 3.9% in 2020 and 4.1% in 2021.

Six economies among the world's 10 fastest growers: Rwanda, Ethiopia, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Tanzania, and Benin.

Investment accounted for more than half the continent's growth, with private consumption accounting for less than one third in 2019.

Expanding digital economy


East Africa-fastest growing region, with average growth at 5.0 % in 2019.

North Africa- the second fastest, at 4.1% in 2019.

West Africa's growth rose to 3.7 % in 2019, from 3.4 % in 2018.

Central Africa is estimated to have grown at 3.2 % in 2019, from 2.7% 2018.

Southern Africa's growth slowed from 1.2% in 2018 to 0.7% in 2019.





In March 2018, African countries signed a landmark trade agreement, the African Continental Free Trade Area Agreement (AfCFTA), which commits countries to remove tariffs on 90 percent of goods, progressively liberalize trade in services, and address a host of other non-tariff barrier. If successfully implemented, the agreement will create a single African market of over a billion consumers with a total GDP of over \$3 trillion. This will make Africa the largest free trade area in the world.

What is less known about the AfCFTA is that its scope exceeds that of a traditional free trade area, which generally focus on trade in goods, to include trade in services, investment, intellectual property rights and competition policy, and possibly e-commerce.

The annual General Assembly (GA) of the World Trade Centers Association (WTCA) is the most prominent event on the organization's calendar, bringing together representatives and business delegations from the over 330 World Trade Centers (WTCs) around the world to a new city each year

GA 2018 was held in Leeuwarden, Netherland, and GA 2019 in Querétaro, Mexico. GA 2023, will be the first in Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA) will be held in Accra, Ghana from 23<sup>rd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> of April 2023.



The 53<sup>rd</sup> GA will be held under the theme: "Towards African Economic Integration and Enhanced Global Presence", and will highlight the unique trade and economic opportunities presented by Africa, touted as the world's next economic frontier, especially in flight of the new Africa Continental Free Trade Agreement (AfCFTA)

# UPDATED COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR KOTOKA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (KIA) REVISION 18: EFFECTIVE DATE: 6TH JANUARY 2023 AT 0000 HOURS (UTC)

- 1. Pre- Arrival/Arrival Processes Travellers intending to enter Ghana
- a. All International passengers including those from the ECOWAS region must complete a Port Health Declaration Form at https://www.ghs-hdf.org/hdf/ before embarkation of flight to Ghana.
- b. All persons arriving in Ghana (citizens, residents, and visitors) who are fully vaccinated will be exempt from any form of testing done either prior to boarding from originating country or on arrival in Ghana EXCEPT PASSENGERS ORIGINATING THEIR JOURNEY FROM CHINA.
- c. Passengers ORIGINATING THEIR journey from CHINA WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT A VALID NEGATIVE COVID-19 PCR TEST RESULT 48 HOURS PRIOR TO DEPARTURE FROM ORIGINATING COUNTRY. In addition, such passengers will be required to UNDERGO MANDATORY COVID-19 TESTING ON ARRIVAL AT THE KOTOKA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT AT NO COST

- d. All OTHER PASSENGERS, ORIGINATING THEIR JOURNEY FROM ELSEWHERE OTHER THAN CHINA (i.e., Ghanaian citizens, permanent residents of Ghana or non-Ghanaians), who ARE PARTIALLY VACCINATED OR UNVACCINATED, WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT A VALID NEGATIVE COVID-19 PCR TEST RESULT 48 HOURS PRIOR TO DEPARTURE FROM ORIGINATING COUNTRY.. In addition, such passengers will be required to undergo mandatory COVID-19 testing on arrival at the Kotoka International Airport AT NO COST
- e. IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE, PASSENGERS MAY BE RANDOMLY SELECTED AND OFFERED TEST ON ARRIVAL
- f. Non-Ghanaians Travelling to Kotoka International Airport with fake or forged vaccination certificates shall be quarantined and returned to the point of embarkation AT THEIR OWN COST.
- g. AIRLINES THAT BRING PASSENGERS TO KOTOKA INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WHO ARE NOT FULLY VACCINATED OR PASSENGERS ORIGINATING THEIR JOURNEY FROM CHINA WITHOUT A VALID NEGATIVE COVID-19 PCR TEST RESULT 48 HOURS PRIOR TO DEPARTURE WOULD BE SURCHARGED \$3500

All Arriving passengers will undergo temperature screening, Yellow Fever Card verification and COVID-19 vaccination certificate verification as required

#### 2. Transit Passengers

- a. Passengers transiting and transferring through KIA will be required to fully adhere to COVID-19 testing requirements at the destination countries.
- 5. Departure Process- Passengers exiting Ghana a. Passengers departing Accra will required to adhere to COVID-19 testing requirements for the destination countries.
- b. Departing passengers will undergo temperature screening at the entrance of Terminal 3 departures 6. Wearing of Nose Mask a. Wearing of nose mask is recommended in all Airport Terminals and ancillary buildings
- 7. Vaccination Definition of Fully Vaccinated A person is said to be fully vaccinated when he/she has taken the full dose of vaccines approved and registered by the Food and Drugs Authority (FDA), Ghana or other vaccines prequalified by WHO.

All Passengers must present a valid COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before embarkation except partially vaccinated or unvaccinated Ghanaians who are required to present a NEGATIVE 48hrs PCR test result to the airline before embarkation and to Port Health upon arrival.

- 8. Traveller Role Uploading the vaccination card onto the PanaBIOS trusted travel platform
- a. Create an account on the AU-endorsed site: https://trustedtravel.panabios.org or on the UNDP-endorsed Global Haven site: <a href="www.globalhaven.org">www.globalhaven.org</a>
- b. Click on the "Trusted Vaccines" tab. c. Choose user type to create vaccination booklet (self or dependent if uploading for someone).
- d. Indicate the country of vaccination.
- e. Choose pathogen/disease (SARS-CoV-2). f. Fill the vaccination campaign column (i.e., Type of vaccines and the number of shots).
- g. Fill the vaccination record (i.e. Batch number, manufacturer, vaccination date and vaccination card number).
- h. Upload the vaccination card.
- i. The system will verify your vaccine records and issue you with a code and a pass.


