




- Founded in 2014, initially as egg layer farm 30.000 layer hens
- Remodelled as Parent stock farm 27.000 productive female capacity
- 6 laying houses and 2 rearing houses 64mt * 12mt
- Currently 4.500 \Qeq (+ \Qed \Qeq (+ \Qed \Qed) ISA Brown and 2.250 \Qeq (+ \Qed \Qed) SASSO Rainbow in production
- Hatchery under construction with capacity of 6.000.000 eggs start-up in 6 months
- Feed mill operational, national training center construction planned in 2026
- Affiliated with Poussins Gertrude Congo in Pointe Noire (RC): 5.500 ♀♀ (+♂♂) ISA
 Brown PS and 2.300 ♀♀ (+♂♂) SASSO Rainbow

The African Poultry Multiplication System in >13 African countries





Results

- Establishment of a Poultry Platform in Kinshasa on the initiative of the Embassy and EFC
- Decision of the Cabinet of Ministers of 18 October 2024: pilot project to revive poultry production in eight centres
- PPP between the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock and EFC
- Significant direct and, above all, indirect jobs planned in the poultry and agricultural sectors in the Congo



Next

- FAO cooperation need DRC government green light
- In cooperation between Eggs For Congo and Poussins
 Gertrude Congo in RC created umbrella Congo Poultry –
 to optimise synergies, increased capacity and greater
 resilience in the event of veterinary diseases
- Early 2026: hatchery operational!?
- Rollout of the APMI model, start of ISA Brown laying strain day-old chicks







What we learned

- Adapt to commercial and political conditions but maintain a long-term perspective and European production standards (including biosecurity and animal welfare).
- Be flexible like the Congolese (to compensate for a lack of planning and unforeseen circumstances such as theft, accidents, breakdowns and huge traffic jams).
- Show that you are combining your commercial interests with the interests of Congolese society in general in a sensitive manner.
- CONGO need poultry!
